3. Report on activities in 2018, 2019 and Workshop 2018

In absence of the main organizer of the past commission workshop 2018 Dražen Tutić held in Hvar, Croatia, commission chair Dušan Petrovič briefly summarized the activities and presented the published workshop proceedings, "Mapping for Outdoor Activities in Mountains," edited by Dražen Tutić, Tom Patterson and Dušan Petrovič. It consists of 261 pages and is printed in full colour. The Hvar workshop was successful in terms of scientific exchange and as a social event. It attracted several first-time participants. Four young attendees who presented at the workshop received the "young scientists' award."

4. Activities at ICC in Tokyo

At the ICC in Tokyo there were two separate Mountain Cartography related sessions and the commission poster, a report of activities of the past four years, was displayed during the conference. On the last day, the General Assembly confirmed the commission for a further four-year term.

As recently informed by the commission chair, the next workshop will take place at the Snow Mountain Ranch, Colorado, USA, from 14 to 18 April 2020.
